We have been blown away with the demand from Venturers to join the Australian Contingent to Venture South. We now have a total of 525 attending, with 418 of those also doing the pre tour. We are the largest Australian Contingent to an international event...EVER!

We have 25 from the Australian Capital Territory, 152 from New South Wales, 8 from the Northern Territory, 27 from Queensland, 30 from South Australia, 4 from Tasmania, 257 from Victoria and 22 from Western Australia.

Myself and the team have been working extremely hard to get this amazing trip finalised and to make additional places available. The pre tour is going to be fantastic, we have locked in some amazing accommodation and activities. We recently met with the NZ Venture Organising Committee and they are progressing well with getting the Venture finalised.

We are rapidly approaching the date when we need to finalise the airline bookings for the Contingent. In order for us to book your flight, you need to have paid at least \$1300 by 20 July.

If you have not paid at least \$1300 by 20 July, additional flight surcharges will apply. The current flight prices are only guaranteed until this date and we don't have room in the budget to absorb higher flight costs due to late payment.

Enclosed with this newsletter is a summary of the payments received to date. Please check this over and if you feel there are any discrepancies, let us know immediately. If you are experiencing financial difficulties please contact us to discuss your options.

When making payments its really important that you use your NZV ID number. We process over 500 payments per month and it's very hard to match up payments without the ID number.

With such a large Contingent we are bound to find a range of allergies, medical problems, and dietary requirements. We have been going through the information provided and so far we have not found anything too concerning.

DO YOU CARRY an EpiPEN® or similar device? We have recently added a new question to the medical page in the registration system. If you carry an EpiPEN® or similar device we need to know. Please log into the registration system and update your details to say – Yes I carry an EpiPEN®.

Also, if you have food allergies etc, please ensure these are listed in BOTH the dietary requirements and allergies sections. If in doubt, please log into the system and check. Remember, you are able to update your medical details online at any point – you don't need to send in a paper application again.

If you have any special medical requirements and would like to discuss these with me, please email admin.nzv2013@scouts.com.au and I will get back to you.



Shirts

Each member of the contingent will receive 2 shirts as part of their kit. On the info sheet enclosed you will find the size you have selected. To make sure your shirt fits comfortably, please check your size against this size chart.

To find your half chest measurement, get one of your shirts that fits you nicely. Then, all you need to do is place the shirt on a flat surface and measure across the chest.

We will be ordering the shirts on 31 July, so you must update your size in the system by then.



What to pack?

Although some people have been wondering, at this point it's too early for us to let you know what to pack. A packing list will be provided once expeditions have been allocated. Although the Venture is in summer and the weather should be fine, the South Island has the potential to get

cold. While waiting for the gear list, you may wish to keep a lookout for warm or wet weather clothing in the upcoming Winter Sales, especially if your allocated expedition is likely to be adventurous. We do advise that you check your sleeping mat and bag are in good order, and update them in the sales if they are not.

Flight & Travel Details

Included with this newsletter is a sheet detailing your departure and arrival airports, including the corresponding dates. Please check this information over carefully to ensure it's correct.

We will be finalising the flight bookings on 20 July 2012. If there are any changes to your departure or arrival airports, we need to know ASAP. If you notify us of a change after this date, additional fees will apply.

If you are planning on staying on in NZ for a family holiday or similar, please ensure that "Independent Travel" is listed as your arrival airport.

We will let you know your exact travel arrangements and times at the Contingent Orientation Days in November. The details for these days are below.

Expedition Allocations

The New Zealand organising committee has advised us that they will be announcing expedition allocations in late September 2012. Allocations are being done on a first come, first served basis, according to the date we received your completed application.

Tents

Around 55 people at this stage have chosen not to take up a Contingent Tent as part of their merchandise. If you are taking your own tent to NZ, it MUST BE BRAND NEW and still in the packaging. NZ Customs are very strict with dirt and will take your tent off you if it is used.

Remember when planning your packing, you need to factor in the weight of the tent when you bring it back. The tent weighs approx 3kg, so that means you can pack 20kg of other stuff when coming home. You may wish to pack some old clothes and shoes that can be thrown out at the end of Venture to make room for tents and extras on the way home.

Also, some people have not chosen which type of tent they would like. The two choices are below. If you do not choose a type by 31 July we will pick one for you. ©

Refund Policy:

If you need to withdraw your application at any point, the following refund policy will apply:

Between 1 May and 30 June 2012 – Refund less \$50 administration fee

Between 1 July and 31 August – Refund less \$1200 unless you can provide a substitute

Between 1 Sept and 31 October – Refund less \$2000 unless you can provide a substitute

After 1 November 2012 – no refund possible.

If you need to withdraw your application, you must advise us in writing (not email).

Travel Insurance

We have received a few enquiries about insurance. Your Contingent fee includes travel insurance, which covers a range of items. As a brief summary, our travel insurance covers:
